Designated Representatives

It is the responsibility of each school's administration to be an active agent at every athletic event enforcing the SCISA Code of Conduct. In the absence of the Head of School or Athletic Director, each school is Required to provide a DESIGNATED REPRESENTA-TIVE at all athletic events, both home and away. The Designated Representative will represent the school's administration and will assist with the enforcement of the Code of Conduct. The Designated Representative will be identified to officials before the start of the contest. They will notify the officials where they will be seated. Each school's Designated Representative should exchange cell numbers or agree to meet if an issue develops. They will assist the officials without hesitation when requested.



Student & Coach Recognition

The Carolina Panthers want your help in recognizing North and South Carolina's best high school varsity football coaches and student-athletes through the Coach of the Week and Community Captain program. Both programs provide awards to each winner for their athletic departments and an in-game presentation at a 2017 Carolina Panthers home game.

High School Coach of the Week

Every year since 1997, the Carolina Panthers have honored high school football coaches through the Coach of the Week program. The Panthers and Toshiba will select a coach for each week of the high school football season. All head coaches in the Carolinas are eligible regardless of their school's size, league, or division. Coaches are evaluated on such factors as the coach's impact on his team, school, and community. Previous coach of the week winners may not be nominated. Also, please note that all nominees will be considered but not all will be awarded.

- Deadline to submit nominations is Friday, September 8th.
- Selected coaches will be honored with an on-field presentation and game ball at the December 17th game versus the Green Bay
- Each Coach of the Week will receive a \$1,000 donation from the Panthers, Toshiba and the National Football League for their school's athletic program.
